

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
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
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Here is one of our distinguished group, out washing his '37 club cab. His wife hasn't been able to get him to wash the modern iron now days though I'll bet.....

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

WE HAD OFTEN TALKED ABOUT DRIVING AN OLD CAR BACK HOME, BUT THIS TIME WE WERE BOTH SERIOUS AND THE TALK SOON WAS BEING TURNED INTO ACTION. MARY 36 WAS A MOTHERS DAY PRESENT IN 1979. THE BODY WORK HAD BEEN ALL COMPLETED, BUT THEN IT GOT A YEARS REST SITTING IN THE GARAGE. THERE WERE MANY, MANY HARD HOURS OR WORK LEFT.


