Well we just returned from our Buckhorn tour and we were very pleased with the accommodations at the Buckhorn lodge.


The scenic drive there was outstanding, even though some of the roads were closed and we had to use alternate routes.

BUCKHORN TOUR

After adjusting the tour to fit the roads that were open to traffic we rounded thru the mountain sides until we were on the rim of the earth, seeing one side on the right the other on the left as we over looked the Bakersfield Valley. As we approached Cuyana Valley we passed a few cattle, a herd of sheep and even the horses stopped to watch the old Fords pass by. The varied variety at the salad bar offered pickled buffalo tongue for those that wished to try buffalo, but not order a steak.

Sunday morning after a peaceful eve of rest, we began our tour homeward around 10:15. The wild flowers that decked the mountain sides made a beautiful sight as we watched the ground squirrels chasing with spring fever.

We stopped by the general store and gas station and was greeted by an 80 yr. old widowed owner and attendant. To those that were there will remember her for here salty and opinionated conversation. She was a very independant person! Her store was something.

By the time we arrived in Mount Penas we went thru light rain and into snow. We held up there for a lunch. Some ordered the hottest chili in the world (my opinion). For one tour attendant it was the biggest snow storm he was in, in his life. That in itself was exciting. Being from Iowa I never saw a first snow fall it just always was.
