Two months ago I received a phone call at work from a Mr. Walt Watson. He wanted to know if I owned an old Ford convertible with a rumble seat. I told him I had two old Ford convertibles, one with a rumble seat and one with a backseat. He wanted to know if both of the cars could be in the Jimmy Stewart National Relay Marathon and I told him yes. The Jimmy Stewart Marathon was to take place April 10, 1983 at Griffin Park.

Well the day arrived and Mary 36 and Dons 40 were both given a bath for their big day. We had to rise mighty early because Mary 36 and Dons 40 were suppose to be at the park by 6:30 a.m. Which meant 5 a.m. for Don and Mary, in order to accomplish the above time. 
