L.A. CITY PLANS
TO THROTTLE
CAR COLLECTORS:

This is the sign that Mary and I wore at the Long Beach Swap meet. We passed out flyers (see center pages of Drive Lines; make copies of them and get the word out) and we got over 500 of them into hands of interested people. The L.A. Planning Commission has proposed a number of amendments to the Municipal Code that if passed could be hurtful to our hobby. I encourage you to get a copy of the Staff report (call the Planning Commission 213-485-3508 and ask for a copy of Case No. 84-349 CA). Then write and express your objections (see address in center page flyer) and/or attend the Public Hearing on August 30 at the Van Nuys Woman's Club (14836 Sylvan Street). It is important that as many of us as possible attend the meeting and I hope that many of you will speak to the issues. The meeting will begin at 10:00 A.M. or shortly after ten if the case before it runs over.

What has the Planning Commission proposed that distresses old car collectors:

- 1. They have defined anyone who has <u>ONE</u> or more vehicles 25 years or older as having an "Historic Vehicle Collection." There is nothing in itself that is harm ful in this definition; however, how this definition is later used in other proposed amendments is then alarming (I will only mention two of the more alarming ones).
- 2. They are proposing that any vehicle restoration on an Historic Vehicle Collection "shall be conducted without the use of spraying of noxious chemicals and without the use of power tools." This, of course, is very discriminatory since the proposed amendment does not apply to recent cars, furniture, boats,

Further, as is true with all the proposed amendments, there are already adequate provisions of control. For example, Municipal Code Section 112.05 stipulates the maximum acceptable noise levels for all powered tools (including specific mention of powered hand tools).

3. Another objectionable feature of the proposed legislation is that a minimum fee of \$340 the first year and an annual renewal of \$100 will be required of all who have Historic Vehicle Collections. Remember, an Historic Vehicle Collection is defined by the first proposed amendment as ONE or more vehicles 25 years or older. That definition can now be used to get you! On top of that, yearly renewal will include an inspection of the site of the Historic Vehicle Collection. This, of course, is all just what you wanted!

Do you now see why I am saying that it is important to express your views to the Planning Commission in writing and/or attend the hearing on Thursday, August 30. I hope to see many of you there.

Now to turn to other matters—pleasant ones. As a club we express our appreciation to Jack Miles who has put in countless hours selling tickets for the raffle car. Our thanks to others that have helped such as Ernie Bailey, Bob Rose, Jerry Jensen, Al Spencer, Larry Caplan, and... We need people to help at swap meets so call Jack Miles to volunteer.

The brunch tour that was led on August 19 by Tourmaster Al Spencer was a delightful success. Though we were short on numbers, the quality of fun that we enjoyed was enormous. The price for the brunch (and this is hard to believe) was \$7.25 per person—that included tax and tip. The conversation was great and the food was superb. The Model-T club had also planned brunch there too. They



NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

PROPOSED AMENDMENT LOS ANGELES MUNCIPAL CODE

ALL COUNCIL DISTRICTS

CITY PLAN CASE NO. 84-349 CA

The City Planning Commission will conduct a public hearing regarding a proposed ordinance to amend the Los Angeles Municipal Code by establishing a permit procedure and conditions under which an historic vehicle collection may be maintained in the Residential and Commercial Zones, and establishing a limit on the number of cars which may be repaired, dismantled, or stored on a residential lot.

TIME: Thursday, August 30, 1984 AFTER 10:00 A.M.

PLACE: Van Nuys Woman's Club

In accordance with City guidelines for the implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act, this proposal was determined to be exempt from the Environmental Quality Act.

The City Planning Commission invites your testimony or written comments. Written communications should be received in the City Planning Commission Office as soon as possible. In order that all viewpoints may be presented, speakers at the public hearing may be limited in the length of their presentations. Because of time constraints and to minimize repetition, the Commission encourages presentations by representatives of organized groups in lieu of many individual speakers.
