



1936 DELUXE PASSENGER CAR EXTERIOR BODY COLORS

I recently received a complimentary letter from an Early Ford V-8 Club member in Kansas requesting some information on 1936 Ford exterior paint options. Others may also be interested in this response.

Production of 1936 models started the second week of September 1935. Some colors were the same as 1935, but there are enough differences to warrant detailing all the 1936 models without comparing them with 1935. Each color used in the first series offered in 1936 was used on the entire body, fenders, wheels and hubcap rings. The colors with the related stripe which were first offered at the beginning of 1936 and continued for the entire model year were:

Black--Bright Apple Green Gunmetal Gray--Medium Bright Poppy Red Washington Blue--Tacoma Cream Cordoba Tan--Medium Bright Poppy Red

Coach Maroon, even though intended for cars built for export, was also available for U.S. production on special order. It also was offered at the beginning of 1936 production and was available for the entire year. When Coach Maroon was ordered for Deluxe cars, wheels were painted the same color. Medium Bright Poppy Red was the stripe color used with beginning of the year Coach Maroon.

Another color offered at the beginning of 1936 production was Gray Vineyard Green with a Silver stripe. This option was replaced by Bright Vineyard Green with a Silver stripe in April 1936. Bright Vineyard Green was discontinued in May 1936.

To stimulate sales in the Spring of 1936, several special "Easter Colors" were offered on Deluxe cars produced only during the month of April 1936. In addition to having wheels and hubcap rings the same as these body and fender Easter Colors, Red or Cream wheels and hubcap rings were also available.

The Easter Colors with related stripe were:

Desert Sand--Red Armory Green--Silver Light Fast Maroon--Gold Bambalina Blue--Cream Coach Maroon--Bright Poppy Red

Of the Easter Colors, Armory Green and Light Fast Maroon were continued as regular production colors for the remainder of 1936.

With the wide selection of factory authorized colors, most customers were satisfied with the choices available. However, some dealers may have offered other options. Remember, Ford policy was "do not lose a sale because of color combination."

Apparently even some assembly plants followed the policy more loosely than Ford liked because in December 1935, the home office issued a corrective directive. The directive said: "It has been found that some assembly branches are not strictly adhering to the color combinations as specified for standard passenger cars, but instead are painting some standard passenger cars in deluxe passenger car colors. Only when extra cost orders are received should this be done."
