
OUR ANNUAL PARTS AUCTION hosted by Bill Norton as auctioneer will be our

WE THE UNDERSIGNED MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING OF THE EARLY PORD V-8 CLUB OF AMERICA, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 6 OF THE REGIONAL GROUP INFORMATION SECTION OF THE CLUB BY-LAWS, DC HEREBY PETITION THE NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS OF THE EARLY FORD V-8 CLUB OF AMERICA FOR A CHARTER TO ESTABLISH THE FORMATION OF A REGIONAL GROUP TO BE KNOWN AS THE SAN PERNANDO VALLEY REGIONAL GROUP OF

THE GENERAL AREA AS KNOWN AS THE SAN PERNANDO VALLEY WHICH LIES WITHIN THE CITY AND COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

THE DIRECT BOUNDARIES ARE AS FOLLOWS: (PLEASE REFER TO ENCLOSED MAP)

ON THE NORTH BY: RINALDI STREET AND THE COUNTY LINE. (AMENDED SEE FOOTNOTE) ON THE WEST BY: THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY LINE.

ON THE EAST BY: THE LOS ANGELES CITY-COUNTY LINE.

AT THIS TIME WE HAVE 17 PAID MEMBERSHIPS, AND SEVERAL OTHER INTERESTED PARTIES. OUR ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND FIRST CLUB ACTIVITY ARE PLANNED FOR THE FORTH OF JULY 1971. SEVERAL OF OUR MEMBERS ARE OR WERE MEMBERS OF THE SCUTHERN CALIFORNIA REGIONAL GROUP AND WILL PROVIDE AN ACTIVE NECLEUS FOR THE FORMATION OF WHAT WE BELIEVE WILL BE THE LARGEST REGIONAL GROUP IN THE CLUB. WE ALSO WOULD LIKE TO MAKE PLANS TO HOST THE 1972 WESTERN NATIONAL MEET.




