Our club has been a member of the ACCC for several years and their influence was demonstrated a couple of years ago when The City of Los Angeles attempted to pass an ordinance restricting the number of automobiles you could have on your property. They are currently lobbying in the areas of mandatory inspections, higher taxes, tougher DMV regulations restrictions on pleasure driving and retrofit of safety devices, where these areas of legislation affect the car collecting hobbyist.

The purpose of the Sacramento conference will be to enhance the ACCC's image in Sacramento, discuss automotive problems and outline goals for the ACCC's future. Please let me know, prior to our next meeting, if you would be interested in representing our club at the conference.






