

15140 Valerio Street Van Nuys, California 91405 786-5008 • 785-9413 If you have replaced the trunk seal on your '39 or '40 sedan, you may have noticed that the new seal causes the trunk lid to close only with some external pressure applied. The only seal available from reproduction sources for these cars is part number 78-713540, illustrated in figure A. The reason the trunk lid closes hard is due to the 78-713540 seal being to "fat". The seal must fit in a channel around the trunk opening as shown in figure B.

In examining the 1939 and 1940 Body Parts list, we find the correct part for both 1940 and 1939 sedans to be 91A-7043720B STRIP (LUGGAGE COMPARTMENT DOOR WEATHER) ASSY TOP AND SIDES. I have an original trunk seal removed from a '39 Tudor. The seal is illustrated in figure C. As you can see, it differs considerably from the

repro seal 78-713540.


A suggested solution to this problem is to make a seal from readily available seals used for other applications. An Au-ve-co 4744 and 4738 glued together as shown in figure D can be used satisfactorily to make a seal that fits and looks more like the original 91A-7043720B seal.

Another combination that will work is to use Au-ve-co rubber weather strip 4722 and 4727 together as illustrated in figure E. Neither of these suggestions duplicate the original seal in exact detail, but I feel they are a better alternative than the "fat" 78-713540 seal.




