



TIPS BY JACK MILES

Restoration costs are always high and one of the areas that can get out of hand is the fasteners. The nuts, bolts, cap screws, trim screws, etc. Right to the point, buying these items in "kit" form is very expensive.

If you are fortunate enough to have purchased a complete car that has not been taken apart before, you posses most, if not all the hardware you need.

If your library includes a comprehensive parts book that covers the year car you are restoring, you will note that in most cases, following a listed part, there will be a list of fasteners that are used to attach the part. It will also "call out" the finish of these fasteners.



Plan your work and work your plan. If you remove a part, make note of the type of fasteners that are used. Fine threads carriage bolts are very hard to come by and cutting or torching them may not be the best policy. Split the nut and save the bolt. Nuts and washers are easy to come by. Thick headed fine thread bolts with pointed end are not.

When I disassemble a unit, such as an engine, I put all the fasteners in two separate containers, one for cadmium plating and the other for "raven" finish.

With a few rare exceptions, cadmium plating and "raven" or semi-gloss black are the only two finishes you will need to do a chassis and body restoration.


Trim screws are for the most part chrome plated but some models have black screws and finish washers. I have found Van Nuys Plating to be the best for the cad plating and "black oxide" finish.

Refinishing and recycling the fasteners from your vehicle will save you hundreds of dollars and buying at swap meets or places like Joe Factor in Burbank will save even more.

Gardner-Westcott in Livonia. Michigan is a good source for stainless trim screws and fasteners. They have a toll free number 800-521-9805 and will send will send a catalog. Their address is 30962 Industrial Rd., Livonia, Mi. 48150.

Swimming pool acid diluted 50/50 will clean those last few fasteners you forgot. Rinse them in hot soapy water and dry them quickly. Heat a spray can of "Krylon" (which I find the best) until it is quite warm and spray on two or three coats.




