They 're at again, attacking collector cars. Senate Bill 155 (SB155) will be trying to impose changes on motor vehicles based on pollutants emitted.

Last year, the Bader Bill tried to have <u>all</u> motor vehicles inspected yearly, and without a dollar limit for compliance to an unknown standard. Through the efforts of the Association of California Car Clubs (ACCC), a letter writing campaign stoped the bill before it ever got to committee.

The new SB 155, sponsored by Senator Leonard, keys in on air pollution. It will take effect January 1, 1992, unless something is done to stop it. At that time an 'mission charge would be added to the registration fee, each year; the charge would be based on certified emissions for each vehicle model and type, as determined by the State Air Resources Board, set at \$25 per gram mile for each of the following emissions: reactive organic gases, oxides of nitrogen, carbon monoxide and particulate matter.


Revenues collected by this emission charge would be deposited in the Clean Emission Fund, created by the bill.

By the way, funds in this fund would be available to subsidize owners of pre-1971 vehicles (providing they owned the car for five years), to purchase low emission vehicles.

It seems that the collector car hobby would suffer right in the pocket book. Most collector cars are not driven at peak hours, and see only limited use on weekends. It may be true that there are some junkers out there that are causing the problem. Chances are that these junkers are being driven without proper registration, and probably uninsured as well. Why punish the multitude for the sins of a few?

If SB 155 sounds wrong to you, the recommendation is to <u>Immediately</u> write a letter to William Leonard, State Capitol, Sacramento, CA 95814, with a copy to Senator Quentin Kopp, Senate Transportation Committee, State Capitol, Sacramento, CA 95814. And, finally send one to your own state senator, expressing your views.

The ACCC helped defeat the BAder Bill last year, in this very same manner. It has been estimated that each collector car owner was saved \$75 per year by killing the Bader Bill. How much will the Leonard Bill cost you? Don't wait to find out.


