

RETURN OF A LOST P-38

Expedition recovers iced Lightning, buried in Greenland glacier 50 years

Fifty years ago last month, during World War II, six Lockheed P-38 Lightning fighters and two Boeing B-17 bombers on the way from Maine to embattled Britain via Iceland, crash-landed on the Greenland icecap as a result of false weather reports from a Nazi radio and because they were running short on fuel.

All 25 U.S. Army Air Force crewmen survived the single largest crash landing of the war and were picked up by rescuers, but the aircraft remained — buried under what became 264 feet of ice since July 1942.

Buried, that is, until the persistent members of the Greenland Expedition Society from Atlanta finally recovered one of the P-38s following drilling of a shaft into the glacier with a hot-water coil nicknamed "supergopher."

Recovery teams had been trying to retrieve the preserved-in-ice "lost squadron" for the past 11 years, as reported by *Lockheed Life* and the *Star* in 1983 and 1985.

Recovery cost is in the neighborhood of \$2 million, the Society says. Financial

support has been given by various companies and individuals.

Although the first P-38 found was dismantled for the lift to the surface, the aircraft appeared to be in good condition except for wrinkled skin on the wing.

"We'll have it flying by 1995," expedition co-leader Richard Taylor predicted. "We're going to have a flier."

Meanwhile, most of the P-38 (all except the center fuselage) was airlifted by the Society's DC-3 transport for display at the Experimental Aircraft Association annual "fly-in" air show in Oshkosh, Wisc., where 800,000 people viewed the 90 percent-complete iced Lightning July 31-Aug. 6.


"There was a tremendous response from the crowds seeing history in the making," said Dick Knapinsky of the EAA. "They were absolutely fascinated by this P-38."

Following the Oshkosh event, the P-38 was transported to Atlanta.

The goal of the Society is to eventually bring to the surface the remaining missing aircraft and to restore and get all eight flying again.

decided to take a modern car.


We started out with six early Fords and three moderns. At least we got to drive behind the old Fords through Zion, Bryce, and Reef






