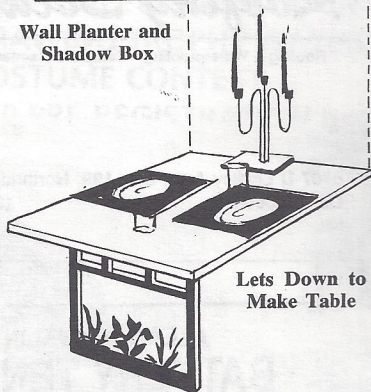
HIDE-A-TABLE—REAL SPACE SAVER

INGENIOUS cabinet makers now make dining tables that you pull out of a hat at mealtime. At least, like the magician's rabbit, they seem to appear from nowhere.

In reality these tables double as cupboard doors, slide into living-room desks, fold up against the wall to become shadow boxes, or screw down to become a low coffee table.



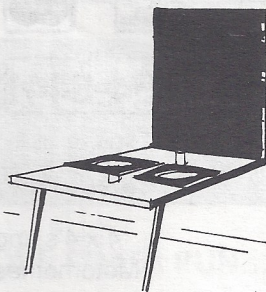
Wall Planter and

Make Table

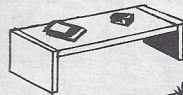
Table—and Shadow Box

THIS let-down table folds up against the wall, then disguises itself as a shadow box and wall planter. Let down, it furnishes ample dining space. Some tables, like roll-away beds, can be raised and hidden behind doors on the wall. And—kitchen tables may have lift-up benches attached to the table, if chairs, too, must disappear between meals.

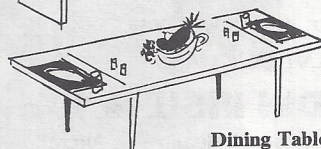


Cupboard-Door Table

THIS cupboard door can drop down quickly at mealtime and become a table top. Finished in the same wood or color as kitchen walls, it is an inconspicuous way of hiding the table—and releasing floor space. This same idea can be applied to a work table for sewing or basement workshop.

Dining-Coffee Table

YOU MAY want a combination dining-coffee table. Ends fold down to serve as supports when the table is used as a coffee table. At mealtime these ends are straightened out to become extension-table leaves for the dining table. Folding legs, concealed under the "coffee table," raise table up to dining height.

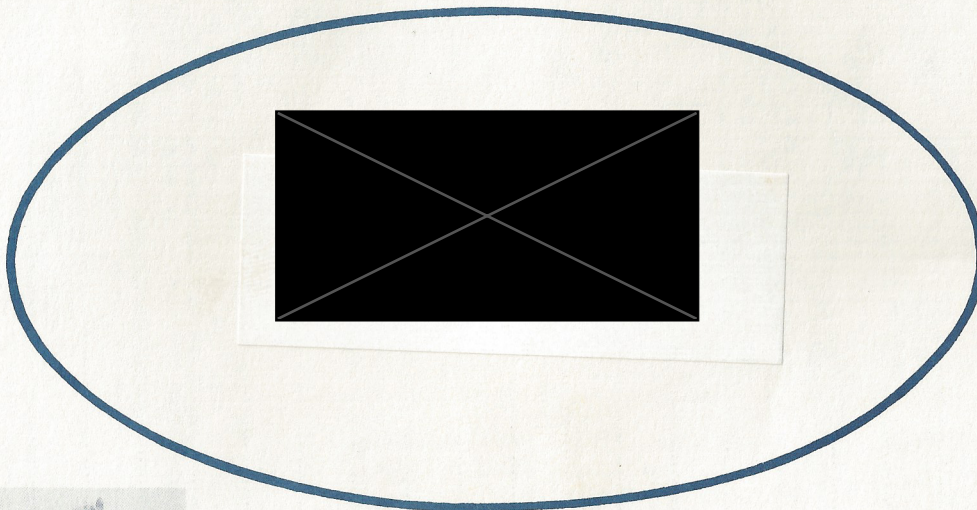
