Last year, I read an article by Old Cars' "Somewhere West of Laramie" columnist Tim Howley about his love affair with the '49 Ford. This inspired me to dig into our family album until I found the enclosed picture of my wife, Margery, and her Birch Grey '49 Ford six.

Somewhere west of Detroit — Garden City, Mich., to be exact — began our love

affair and her '49 Ford.

We had been married about a year and Marge had bought a book of tickets on a new Ford at something like five for a dollar. It was to be given away by a group of the city fathers on the last night of the carnival. We stayed quite late but tickets were still coming in and she had to go to work the next morning so we went home. I had just been laid off.

As we were about to get into bed there were cries and yelping out on the lawn and banging at our door. Everyone wanted to be first to tell us she had won the new car. We got dressed and drove down to the Ford garage and a man was just putting it inside for the night. I asked him who had won the car and he said "a

woman named Woods."

As this is over 40 years ago I don't recall all the details but when we went to pick up her "free" car we found we owed quite a good sum of money. It seems that the local realtor wanted to give away a Cadillac but the city fathers felt with times the way they were a Ford was more in line. This angered the realtor who usually sold as many tickets as everyone else put together, so he refused to sell any tickets that year.

Besides the usual charges, tax, license, and title, we found that we also had to pay for the radio and heater. Apparently this drawing had cost the local city fathers their collective shirt. At the time this was

Later we took a vacation and drove to New Brunswick, Canada. On our return trip back into the states we were on the Connecticut Turnpike (or maybe it was called the "Parkway"). At a toll booth a police car screamed past us and blocked the bridge. I told my wife we had better stay put because they were sure after someone. It was us!

I was told to follow the police car back to the police station in the nearest small town. The police car went into a drive and drove around back, I parked out front and we walked in. That was my second mistake, I was suppose to drive around back so they could check out our "souped-up" motor. I was given a choice after being taken to the basement where the jail was. We could stay in town until the next time

court was held (court was on Wednesday and this as Thursday), or they would lock me up to be sure we didn't leave. I told the officer in charge that I didn't have much choice as I was due back in camp on Saturday and if I wasn't I'd be locked up when I got back. That was one time being in the National Guard paid off. We were leaving on our two-week maneuvers.



I was told that the unmodified engine was all that saved me and for my first transgression of the law I was given a warning ticket for 98 mph and told a copy would be sent to my local police in Michigan. Later, I got a job in a factory in Detroit right behind the factory where my wife worked in the office. We would ride together when possible but one night I had to work several hours overtime so she got a ride home.

It has been snowing hard all afternoon and when I came out around nine a.m. the bright lights of the parking are showed only a line of bumpers of the carbacked against a fence. I thought that if I ever saw a commercial for a car starting in adverse conditions this would be it.

The snow was light and fluffy. As it was very cold, I was easily able to dig a path with my hands to the car door and get in. When I turned the key the Ford's motor started instantly and I pulled right out of the drift.

Maybe on our 49th anniversary we will find another Birch Grey 1949 Ford six and celebrate our love affair. If such a car is available at that time I am sure I will find it in your classified ad section

It was such a pleasure for all the volunteers', who donate their time at Loaves & Fishes, to make so many people happy during this special time of year!


I can't thank you all enough for your generosity and kindness. I wish you all a Healthy and Happy New Year.

SCRAPPAGE UPDATE

Do scrappage programs make you mad? The present programs allow oil companies to buy up old cars in the smoggy areas and destroy them. The scrapped cars must have been licensed continually in the smoggy area, but nobody knows exactly how much the cars were driven every day. They might not have been driven at all. Even so, scrapping the cars gives the oil company "credits" for eliminating pollution. The "credits" are used by the oil companies to delay installation of pollution controls at their refineries. The atmosphere ends up with a small amount of lowered pollution from the scrapped cars, and continuing enormous pollution from the refineries. UNOCAL Corporation advertised on January 5 in L.A. for 1,200 cars, offering to pay \$600 for 1972-74's and \$700 for 1971 and earlier models. Within a week they had their 1,200 cars. These programs were started in several areas of the state by local air pollution control boards, without any vote or approval from the public.

These programs have been so successful that now the plan is to take them into all six of the smoggy areas in the state. There will be no oil company participation in the new plan. It comes direct from the California Air Resources Board (CARB), and they want to scrap 75,000 old cars per year. To get people to scrap their cars, CARB proposes paying \$1,000 for each car. And quess where that money is going to come from. It's coming right out of your pocket. California Legislature approves it, they will either add \$100 to the price of every new car, or put another \$1 on every renewal of vehicle registration, upping it to \$9 instead of the present \$8. (It was \$7 last year in the Los Angeles area. They just added another dollar January 1.) You can bet that the new car dealers are going to protest so much that the \$100 idea will be dropped, so that means they will get it \$1 at a time from you and me. If you don't like this idea, write to your California state assemblyperson or California state senator, and tell them that you don't want to pay for scrapping cars.


