

Motorhead Ed

My love affair with things with wheels, especially automobiles, and Fords in particular, goes back to my earliest memories. Scrounging in trash piles would sometimes yield cast off coaster wagon wheels and axles which I would attach to a two by twelve and then tow to the hill behind our house. The thrilling ride down is only duplicated in a Calvin and Hobbs cartoon strip.

Dad had a 1935 Ford 1 1/2 ton truck with a stock rack during the Second World War. I would spend hours sitting in the cab, shifting gears, pretending to drive and making engine noises as the truck sat quietly in our farm yard. By the time I was seven I would sit on Dad's lap and steer the Ford Truck down country roads. I credit that golden orange and black truck with my lifelong love of Fords.

My parents bought a new Willys Jeep in January 1948 and a couple of months before my eleventh birthday I was allowed to drive the mile and a half to the mailbox by myself. The following summer I drove a one horse hay rake during the hay harvest earning \$78. I bought a 1930 Model

A Fordor for \$65 and it kept me broke keeping it running.

Early in the summer of my thirteenth year I replaced the piston rings and tightened up the bearings of the Model A. After some trial and error and advice of some patient adults the little Ford ran just fine. As my mechanical experience and physical size increased I worked more on our family ranch, began maintaining our tractor and ranch equipment and, of course, increased my income.

The next summer I bought a nice, good running 1936 Ford pickup. Shortly after I was fifteen I traded the Model A in on a well worn 1940 Ford Deluxe Coupe with a good '42 Mercury engine. On my sixteenth birthday I got my Oregon drivers license - then the fun began. The Merc engine in the '40 was loose and fast. I built headers and added dual pipes. It sounded good with 18" echo cans.

During my High School years I sold the '36 pickup, bought a '36 five window coupe for \$75 (also with a Merc engine), rebuilt our jeep which had been worn out with the rigors of ranch work, disassembled the '40 coupe to be channeled and customized and bought three 1932

Model B Tudor sedans which cost \$20, \$35, and \$50. I had also hauled home the remains of a '36 cabriolet and a '34 cabriolet body. What I really wanted was a 1932 Ford roadster but it would be a few years before that dream would be realized

The '40 coupe was channeled 4 inches, fitted with an Olds Rocket V-8 and Caddy side shift transmission driving a Lincoln Zephyr rear axle and Columbia two-speed to 8.20 by 15 tires. The coupe was a dark metallic blue, went to the Air Force with me in 1960 and sold in New Jersey in 1965.

During the past thirty years the '34 cabriolet body was sold to Jack Chard at a L.A. Roadster swap meet, the '36 coupe was restored by a former Valley V-8 member, one of the '32 Tudors was restored and the body of the third went to a street rodder in Northern California and was converted to a sedan delivery.

I was led astray while in the Air Force to a Triumph TR3 and two Mercedes, a '52 followed by a '62. The Mercedes' required constant maintenance and repair and caused me to never own another foreign automobile. Today, it's gotta be built by FORD to be in my fleet.


1st Annual Past Presidents Day B-B-Q




