


PEPPERMILL 1995 REPORT

A Blue '42 Lincoln owned by John Malta won The Dipstick (Needs Help).


Gayle and Mickey Remund won The Fonz (Best Street Rod or Custom) with their '34 Ford 5 Window Coupe.




