

THE VALLEY V8'S 25TH ANNIVERSARY YEAR


Hello Fellow Club Members:


An Ex-car friend gave me four 15 in. Radial tires mounted on rims. But they're not white walls. What should I do?

























Other Saturday dates include:

Many of their first customers related; part chasing is therapy and they enjoy being around cars and car people, and that car people are a good group of people.







WATCHING THE 1937 FORDS GO BY WITH PETER WINNEWISSER

A Day With Ford

Ford Motor Co. and the City of Detroit, Mich. had never seen anything like it. On Nov. 6-7, 1936, the world's largest automotive gathering - 8,200 Ford dealers - assembled in Dearborn to meet Ford executives. see the 1937 line, present the restored Cape Cod Windmill to Henry and Edsel Ford for Greenfield Village and visit the Ford activities. It was the first such event since the company was founded more than 35 years

earlier.

Forty-one special trains brought the dealers to Detroit. In addition t.o dealers from all over the United States and Canada. there were Ford men from the Hawaiian Islands, the Canal Zone, Germany, England and filling every and Windsor.

an overflow 2,500 had to be quartered in a special "Pullman City," in the railroad yards.


New '37 Ford cars and trucks. These were introduced by J. R. Davis, assistant to the director of sales, who stated that the Ford program for 1937 was more important than two recent milestones in Ford history - the introduction of the Model A in 1927, and the V-8 in 1932.

Now came the long-awaited moment. The amphitheater was darkened and a pencil of light picked out the center of the stage, where a huge V-8 emblem could be seen rising on

the elevablonde "V-8 elf" untwined herself from the emblem. Joined by other elves, she began tossing giant Ford V-8 parts. illustrat-

"Today marks an important epoch in the history of Ford Motor Co. Never has the public been given more for its money than in the 1937 product. Onward with Ford for 1937."



Dealer cards for the 1937 Ford were sent to prospects by salesmen. "This 1937 Ford Tudor i sedan in fine condition," said the message. other foreign "Powerful V-8 motor. Drive this car and you'll appreciate its modern appointments and hotel in Detroit smooth ride. It's waiting for you . . . today."
