



CHERRY-CHOCOLATE CHIP/OATMEAL COOKIES By Patti Smith

2 cups all purpose flour teaspoon baking soda 1 1/2 teaspoon salt 2-1/2 sticks unsalted butter (room temp) 1 cup sugar 1 cup brown sugar (packed) 2 large eggs 2 teaspoons vanilla extract 1 teaspoon almond extract 2 cups old fashioned oats 3 cups semisweet chocolate chips 2 cups dried tart cherries 1 cup slivered almonds, toasted

Sift together flour, baking soda and salt, then set aside. Using an electric mixer, beat butter, sugar and brown sugar in a large bowl until well blended. Mix in egg and both extracts. Beat in flour mixture. Mix in oats, then chocolate chips, cherries and almonds. Drop by rounded teaspoons onto baking sheets, spacing 2 inches apart. Bake at 375 degrees for 9-11 mins. Allow cookies to cool slightly on baking sheet, then remove to rack to finish cooling. Can be stored in an air tight container for up to one week.

PAT'S KITCHEN

Lemon Tea Cookies

- 2 teaspoons finely shredded lemon peel
- 4 teaspoons lemon juice
- 2/3 cup milk
- 1 cup margarine
- 3-1/2 cups all purpose flour
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 cup lemon juice

Stir the 4 teaspoons lemon juice into the milk. Let stand 5 mins. Beat butter or margarine with an electric mixer on medium to high speed for 30 secs. Add about half of the flour. 1-1/2 cups sugar, the eggs, baking powder, baking soda, lemon peel, and milk mixture. Beat until thoroughly combined. Beat in remaining flour.

Drop by rounded teaspoons onto ungreased cookie sheet, bake in a 350 degree oven for 10 to 12 minutes or until edges are lightly browned. Cool cookies on a wire rack. Stir together remaining sugar and the 1/4 cup lemon juice; brush on cookies while they are still warm. Makes about 6 dozen.
