MASHED SWEET POTATOES WITH BROWN SUGAR AND PECANS

1 cup packed golden brown sugar

1 cup chopped pecans

1 cup chilled butter, cut into
1 inch pieces

- 5 pounds red-skinned sweet potatoes (yams), peeled, cut into $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch pieces
- 4 large eggs
- 3 tablespoons pure maple syrup
- 2 tablespoons vanilla extract
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- 2 teaspoons salt

Preheat oven to 350°F. Mix sugar, pecans and butter in small bowl. Cover and chill until ready to use.

Butter 13X9X2-inch glass baking dish. Cook sweet potatoes in large pot of boiling salted water until very tender, about 12 minutes. Drain. Let stand in colander 15 minutes. Puree sweet potatoes.

Beat eggs, syrup, vanilla, lemon juice and salt in large bowl. Mix in pureed sweet potatoes. Transfer sweet potato mixture to prepared dish. Sprinkle pecan topping evenly over mixture.

Bake until sweet potato mixture is set and topping bubbles, about 1 hour. Let stand 15 minutes before serving. 12 to 14 servings.


