

THE YEAR 1974

A YEAR OF GROTH AND ACTIVITY

IN SPITE OF THIS BEING THE YEAR OF THE "GASOLINE CRUNCH" WE HAD A NUMBER OF EXCELLENT WELL ATTENDED TOURS.....

STARTING THE YEAR WITH A BANG, OUR FIRST TOUR LED BY DON DURKEE, TOURED THE BACK COUNTRY FROM THE WEST SAN FERNANDO VALLEY ALL THE WAY TO THE HILL OVERLOOKING VENTURA AND INCLUDED A LUNCH STOP AT THE DEPOT IN CAMERILLO... THIRTY EARLY FORDS REPRESENTING SEVERAL CLUBS WENT ON THE SENIC DRIVE......

ORANGE CINNAMON OATMEAL BREAD


1 1/2 tsp active dry yeast
1 cup plus 2 Tbs bread flour
1/2 cup whole wheat flour
1/2 cup rolled oats
2 Tbs wheat germ
2 Tbs powdered milk
1 tsp ground cinnamon
1 Tbs grated orange zest
2 Tbs vegetable oil
2 Tbs honey
1/2 tsp salt
3/4 cup plus 2 Tbs water

Add all ingredients in the order suggest by your bread machine manual and process on the basic bread cycle according to the manufactures directions. (1 Lb loaf)

But then something happened.


