




cable brakes for hydraulics. Don recently installed a fresh '59 A engine, and wants to replace Gene's 50 year old paint job to blend with the interior which looks new.







It's a big job, but being able to work more closely with all these wonderful people makes it all worthwhile.

Genesis of Local Regional Groups

(Some things you didn't want to know, but I'm telling you anyway)

One hundred years after the birth of our beloved Henry Ford, three men got together in a high school metal shop in San Leandro California and laid the groundwork for the Early Ford V-8 Club of America, dedicated to the preservation and restoration of 1932 to 1940 Ford company vehicles. Five years later, in 1968, Sam Chastain placed an ad it the L.A. Times and soon five V-8ers were granted a charter for the Southern California Regional Group #11. V-8 enthusiasts from all over southern California converged on the meeting room adjacent to the auditorium at South Gate park for the 2nd Sunday of the month meetings.

Members from the San Diego area soon decided that it was too far to drive to South Gate, so they broke away and formed San Diego Regional Group # 19. Some San Fernando Valley V-8ers felt the same way, so in 1971 they formed Regional Group #40. The So. Cal. Group met on the 2nd Sunday of the month, so the Valley V-8ers chose the 1st Sunday for their meetings so they could still attend the So. Cal. meetings.

But wait, the brake-always were not through. A group of Valley V-8ers broke away to form Ventura Regional Group # 84 and another group of V-8ers broke away to form Baldy View Regional Group # 88. While a large percentage of the current So Cal. members are from Orange County, the Orange County Regional Group #92 was only active for a short time and is no longer active.

Not having enough room on their Orange County homesites to build garages prompted members such as Bud Williams, Dan Krehbiel and Jay Harris to move away and eventually form the Palomar Mountain Regional Group #148 in northeast San Diego County.

Jay Harris was National Meet Chairman for the '74 San Diego event, again when So. Cal. R.G. sponsored the '99 meet in Dana Point, and is currently the Meet-head for the 75th Diamond Jubilee Meet that Palomar Mountain R.G. is planning for June 2007.

After much discussion and heated debate, membership for the National Club was expanded to include the 1941 to 1948 years and eventually expanded to 1953 to encompass all the flathead years. Vehicles eligible for concours judging are not just '53 and earlier flathead V8's though, since they also include 4, 6 and V 12 flathead engines, the overhead valve V8 Lincolns, and even the flathead V8 produced in Canada in 1954.
