

"So keep this in your mind.


The man must never ever know,

Looking back twenty years, to 1987, Dave Sanborn passes the gavel to John Kemmerer. Officers include, vice president, Pat Berry, secretary, Julie Blackwell and editor, Chuck Mair. Larry Caplan, tightly clutching the purse strings, as treasurer, lets Kemmerer know that the profits from *Ventura Ventures* are about gone and admonishes him that he will be closely monitoring expenses. Tours, handled in the past by the vice president, are now in the creative hands of Gerry Blackwell.

Thanks to the efforts of Virginia Wolf and Nino Rosso, the club has a permanent meeting place. With plenty of lighted parking, Mercury Savings, on the corner of Magnolia and Laurel Canyon, in North Hollywood, serves us well. The January meeting is highlighted by Don Durkee's presentation, on the installation of replacement running board covers.

Jerry Jensen is in the spotlight, at the February meeting, with his indepth demonstration on the installation of seat covers, panels, headliners and top pads. Paul Kirk provides refreshments, for the meeting. The Club receives a note from National President, Fred Herrlein, thanking us for our participation in the National's successful membership drive, resulting in 1584 new members. In recognition of our members' efforts, a copy of the National's recently produced *V-8 Album* is included with his letter. The album was part of the goodies in the May auction. The month's activities conclude, with a tour to the reclamation plant and Japanese Garden, in the Sepulveda Basin and lunch at the 94th Aero Squadron. The Durkee's celebrate their 27th wedding anniversary.

Don Dupree is the center of attention at the March meeting, with a talk on Ford ignition systems. Don's program includes testing the members' coils, regulators and distributors, brought to the meeting. Tom Welch, is back in attendance. In lieu of a driving tour, this month, a group of members, led by Sanborn, journey to Portland, Oregon, for the annual swap meet. They camp out at Jo & Jerry Veleys', while there.

April 1st has John Kemmerer presenting a men's night program, "Learn to keep your mouth shut, or learn to live without it!" The following weekend, with the ladies back among us, Doug Peterson leads the flock, up the highway, for the April wild flowers sojourn. There's a dearth of

flowers. However, traveling via Mojave Airport, to see the Voyager, with a stop at the Loop at Tehachapi and dinner at the Bakersfield Chateau Basque, the tour is a big hit. A busy April closes with the Durkee's doing their usual fine job, hosting the Solvang shebang.

Win Burkhardt, one of the founding members of the Association of California Car Clubs, is the speaker, at our July meeting. Later that month, Pat Berry takes us on a hot drive, for even hotter chili, as he guides the tour to Wheeler Springs. Blacky Blackwell is putting the finishing touches on his roadster, for the Western Regional Meet.

With the Western National being held in Bend, Oregon, the first week of August, the Club and *Drive Lines* go dark, for the month. Three days after rebuilding the motor, and a day after shooting it with a fresh coat of paint, in his Burbank back yard, Pat Berry, drives his six cylinder flathead '50, to Bend. Also, Jim Britain, of the Ventura Regional group leads an overnighter, to Santa Maria and Oso Flaco. A stop at Nojoqui Falls Park, for lunch and games, culminates a fantastic weekend.

With his superb presentation, on gauges and horns, Dr.Larry Caplan is the focus of the November meeting. The following week the annual breakfast tour, to the Peppermill, in Pasadena, is held. Coordinated by Dave Sanborn, the breakfast get together includes participation from members of the Valley, Ventura, Southern California and Baldy View regional groups, giving the members a chance to interact with their neighbor clubs, with a morning of fun, food and friendship. Tours for the year conclude with Gerry Blackwell herding us to Merle Norman's San Sylmar, on November 14th.

Al and Ruth Spencer have everything, other than the rain, under control, at Reuben's Summer House in Woodland Hills, for the Holiday Installation Dinner on December 4, 1987. The master of ceremonies soon discovers that no one has ordered the out going president's award. After some good-natured finger pointing, Pat Berry and Julie Blackwell put their collective heads together and make a quick trip to the Topanga Mall, purchase an umbrella and present it to the president. Following additional awards and recognitions, installation of the incoming board and a gift exchange, the gavel is passed to Dudley Ochsner, for the beginning of another chapter, in Valley V-8 Club history.
