



Program for the evening: Chuck Sternburg presented a slide show of pictures from when he was a WWII pilot. He flew PBY-5 Catalina aircraft. He has owned a '32 Ford, '36 Sedan and other old cars. Now he has Italian cars, 5 Maserati's, a Lamborghini, Jaguars and more. The PBY-5 sea plane carried 1500 gals. of gas. They flew at 8,000 to 10,000 ft. They burned 80 gal. of gas an hour and flew about 14 hrs. They were painted black and flew at night to patrol. No satellite back then. He was there from June '44 to March '45. He was all over the South West Pacific. They had to go 60 to 72 knots to take off. He was also a navigator. You had to open the "clam shell" to fire the gun. Everyone was trained to be a gunner. There were 8 to 10 crew members. They were the Black Cat. Brisbane, Australia was the maintenance area. A golf tee was used as an emergency fix for a hole. They tried to avoid river landings. 


