


Program for the evening: Harrison "Scotty" Scott presented a slide show about the Ridge Route, "The Road that united California" In 1915 the ridge route went from Castaic over the Tehachapi Mts. to Bakersfield. Many people think the Grapevine got its name because the original highway had a series of switchbacks to allow the early cars to climb the grade. Actually it came from the early wagoneers who had to travel through thick grapevines and called it Canyon of the Grapes. In 1933 the 3 lane Ridge Alternate was built and is now the I-5. The State Bureau of Highways was started in 1895. In 1910 an \$18million dollar bond was approved for highway construction. There was much discussion about the best location for the new highway. Auto Club of America posted all signs on the highways until 1946 when the State of California took over. Scotty had many interesting stories and pictures from the early days. The 2nd Saturday of every month is a work day on the Ridge Route. Check this web site for more information. http://www.ridgeroute.com/
