



Program for the evening: Randy Watson presented a slide show about his Navy career He graduated high school in 1957 in Illinois in a class of 33 students. He went to the University of Illinois and had to take 2 yrs. of ROTC after which he joined the Navy for a 21 year career. His first assignment was the USS Rockbridge attack ship. He trained as a navigator. He was on the Project Magnet assignment, three planes went on many trips around the world. He did the navigating. There were many challenges. He was involved in magnetic measurement, one was measuring the San Andres Fault. He was sent to Iceland in 1963. The volcano in the Atlantic ocean close to Iceland that erupted in Nov. '63 formed an island and was named Surtsey.

In Monterey, Ca. He was on the USS Ranger going to Viet Nam in 1970. It was a 3 month cruise. 1974 -76 he was on the F-14 Tomcat Fighter Squadron. He was a Navy Tech representative at Hughes Aircraft in 1976. Last tour in Point Mugu. Retired in 1983 Lt. Commander.
