



High School Memories

After seeing the above restored 1946 C.O.E., "cab over engine" at the Bakersfield Street Rod Nationals, it sure brought back high school memories.

It was the first of May 1955,1 was a sophomore in high school. My father stopped at the local Ford garage in Maquoketa, Iowa to buy Ford tractor parts. The service manager asked my father "how are things were going on the farm"? My Dad answered that he had too many boys and not enough tractors. The service manager said "we can fix that; we can sell you another tractor or put one of your boys to work at the garage." We need a young lad to chase parts and do odd jobs." My Dad said, "I can't afford another tractor, but you can put the oldest boy to work for you, he is sixteen years old." Boy was I excited about going to work at a Ford dealer.

I started on May 15,1955 and I even got out of school a couple days early, because I had a

summer job to go to.

I had many jobs at the dealership such as: sweeping floors, washing windows, cleaning toilets, helping mechanics, etc... The best job was delivering farm machinery with a 1939 C.O.E. Ford truck with a 16 ft. long bed. This was a pretty long bed for a 1939 Ford truck. The old truck was hard to drive because it was a 4-speed scratch box transmission, no synchronized transmission

When I was first driving the truck, one of the mechanics saw that I was having trouble shifting. He came out of the garage and said, "get over to the passenger seat and I will show you how to shift without scratching the gears." "You have to learn to how to double the clutch when you shift." I was so excited to learn how to shift that old truck without scratching the gears. I was able to shift up or down without scratching them that first day of driving.

One cold rainy day I was delivering a tractor to a farmer. The fanner said, "you have a bad exhaust leak right below where you are sitting." "I know, but my boss doesn't want to fix it, I just have to drive it that way." The farmer explained the exhaust leak could kill me. "Just drive over to my workshop, he said, "and I will fix it for you. He cut off the muffler and tailpipe and replaced it with a straight piece of well pipe. This fixed it, but made the truck kind of noisy. She really cackled going down the hills and this sounded kind of "kool" to me.

The same mechanic that showed me how to shift, also told me that the truck was old and the engine tired. He had me check the oil and water every day before driving it. "Don't drive it too fast," he told me. The straight tailpipe made it sound like you were going faster than you really

were.

One time, some farmer told my boss that I was driving too fast on "them country roads" I had

to tell my boss that "it sounds like I'm going fast, but I really wasn't."

Shortly after that, Ed, one of the salesmen, was driving the truck and he knocked the rods out of it. Of course the boss called me into his office and gave me hell for driving the old truck too fast. I said it wasn't my fault, but the salesman's fault. He didn't even know how to shift the transmission without scratching the gears. The mechanic that taught me to shift helped me convince the boss that it was not the "kid's" fault. He told the boss to find a used engine and he and I would put the engine in the C.O.E. after hours.

He said the "kid" really enjoyed driving the truck. The mechanic told the boss the reason the kid liked the truck so much is that you sit up high in it. He explained mat when you pull up beside other cars, with girls in them wearing loose fitting blouses, you can sometimes get an "eye full".

So the mechanic and I put a used engine in the C.O.E. This engine was not very good and the mechanic told me, "be careful, mis engine is not going to last very long."

Just a week later, the other salesman, Eldon, got it hot and cracked the block. Guess what? Yep, I got called in again to get my a __ chewed again. I told the boss I wasn't the guy causing the problems. After a long discussion, he called both salesmen and myself into his office. He told both salesmen, "if you want anything delivered, you have to have Don deliver it." During school, they would have to wait until after 4 PM when school was out.

My boss told me to take the engine with the cracked block back to the junkyard where it came from. I got to drive our wrecker to get the engine replaced. My mechanic friend told me just what to say to the junkyard man. The junkyard man told me he would give me the engine out of a

rolled over '48 Merc. Now that was a real good engine with a lot of power!

My mechanic friend helped me put the 2 engine in the C.O.E. one night after work. By now we were getting good at replacing engines in the C.O.E. We both knew just what to do. After getting this engine running the mechanic said, "This is a good engine, you can drive this truck any speed you want and you will not hurt the engine." He continued, "just remember to check the oil, water and especially the gas gauge." "You don't want to run out of gas."

I worked there until I got out of high school and joined the army. Yes I drove that C.O.E. a little fast sometimes and it would really cackle downhill. Every once in a while a farmer would tell my boss "that kid really drives that green truck up and down these country roads too fast." My boss called me into his office after working there a year. He said, "I did not call you into my office to chew you're a __out again." "I have heard some people say you drive too fast, but you have never gotten any speeding tickets and you always take good care of the equipment." "Don, you always get the job done well". He continued, "I know you are going into the army after liigh school, but when you get out of the army, I would like you to come back to work for us." "You can be a mechanic, salesman, or you've said you would like to work in the body shop."

After the army, that is exactly what I did. hi 19601 started working in the body shop of that Maquoketa, Iowa Ford dealership. In fact, most of my life, I worked as a Ford body shop

manager.

Driving that 1939 C.O.E with a good flathead convinced me that them flatheads are good engines. Today, I own 10 flathead cars. Flatheads are a way of life for me and I drive one almost The Iowa Farm Boy every day.
