

Our program for the June meeting will be another chance to hear the stories of a true Southern California Flathead Ford Racing Icon. Our speaker will be Alex Xydias the famous founder of the SOCAL SPEED SHOP. Alex started this business shortly after the end of WWII and the rest is all well known history today. Alex and his friends raced many early cars on the dry lakes and Bonneville salt flats achieving unheard of speeds using our beloved flathead Ford V8s. For our program this month Alex will tell the story of how a group of Southern California Hot Rodders were able to cut through the government red tape and gain permission to use the Bonneville Utah Salt Flats for high speed racing. We owe a debt of thanks to our own John Wolf who is a long time close friend of Alex and helped to make this program possible.

There is a favorite saying in my area, Confucius Say "Man who driving old unmodified car on a unmaintained freeway, Soon have widow in car selling business." That being said I think that most of us like to show our cars and some times that means night driving. If your lights are like mine they are about as bright as two choir boys in the back of a church holding lighted candles. It has come to light (pun intended) that there is now a legitimate source for 6 volt Halogen **HEADLIGHT BULBS**. The fellow putting this on the market is in Australia. His name is Anthony Pearson. At **classicandvintagebulbs.com.** 82 Cummings Street, Blackwood 5051,

South Australia. He does have a North American distributor, but it might be easier to deal direct to eliminate socket confusion. It is said that these bulbs use the same wattage as the original bulbs, so rewiring may not be needed. It is recommended that you also really shine up those old reflectors or have them replated. Also, think about that old switch on the dash and the high and low beam switch on the floor, both a source very high resistance (relegate them to a secondary source to activate the lights via relays in the new circuit). My recommendation is to run a 10 or 12 gauge wire connected directly to the battery over to the front left side near the head light. At that spot put in two 6 volt relays that you can buy form the electric fan suppliers. This way, you will see and be seen. This will truly light up your life. You will just have to put up with the joshing the Grandkids will give you, for modifying your stock car. J.K.


