

Valley V8's "Roadside Americana" By Scotty Cramolini January 2025

Since we all drive vintage V8 Fords (and other makes) that were once familiar with the Sunday drive, road trips, unique simple eateries, Drive-Ins, Motels and eclectic roadside architecture, I thought I'd highlight some of those memories with a "once a month" bit of nostalgic trivia in our newsletter for 2025. This is the 3rd in a series of that fun and simple era of "Roadside Americana" that we all had the privilege of growing up in, and sadly, which has long passed away THE FIRST MO-TEL Before the ubiquitous "cookie cutter" Days Inn, Motel 6, Holiday Inns, Sheraton's, etc. there were hotels, Inns, motor courts and wayside campgrounds located within city limits or sporadically dotted throughout the countryside. These communal bathroom and dining stopovers provided a nights stay but were either too pricey for the common man, didn't allow much privacy and/or were furnished. The motoring, adventure seeking public in the 1920s were looking for an affordable overnight lodging experience that would provide a clean room, private restroom facilities and nearby diner and service station (with a full-time mechanic). Thus, the MO-TEL was inaugurated (a portmanteau: the blended word of motor and hotel) The first "MO-TEL" in the world was opened just up the road - in San Luis Obispo, CA on December 12, 1925. Located on the northwestern outskirts of the city aside Highway 101, it was originally called the "Milestone Mo-tel" and later simply called the Motel Inn. The new style of lodging was strategically located halfway between the 400 mile Los Angeles to San Francisco route; then, a 2-3 day trek. The motel was designed by architect Arthur Heineman, who plied on the "mission" theme". Rooms were \$1.25 per night. Plans were in the works for 18 additional motels of similar design. Sadly, the Great Depression came shortly thereafter the first prototype was built and snuffed out that proposed plan; additionally causing the original Motel Inn to go into foreclosure.
