It is the oldest residence in the San Fernando Valley and second oldest in the City of LA! Built in 1834 on Sepulveda Blvd. After going through its history up to the present day, she said tours are available on Sundays and Mondays. Then Stephanie shared about the San Fernando Pioneer Cemetery in Sylmar, corner of Foothill and Bledsoe. It is the 2nd oldest cemetery in the Valley. Beginning in 1874, then called the Morningside Cemetery. It has gotten much smaller over the years. Interesting and sadly, it has been vandalized numerous times over the years. There are only 13 original headstones left. They also offer tours. Every Saturday a group of volunteers meet to keep grounds kept up. All are welcome.

CAR OF THE MONTH


This month's "car of the month" is Larry Caplan's 1940 Pick-up Larry purchased the truck in the mid 1990's at the Car Swap Meet at the Rose Bowl. From this point he began its 13 year one man restoration. This was an amazing task as Larry did all of the restoration of the mechanics, body work, and paint by himself. The interior was done by Jerry Jensen, a longtime member of the Valley V8's. Larry also did the research in areas that were in question to make sure that they were correct to factory specifications. The entire truck was restored as a "Dealer Demonstrator". This means this is how a truck would be delivered to a dealership from the factory to be used as a reference for customer purchase.

Larry's research paid off, as the truck upon its completion, was entered into judging at the Early Ford V-8 National Meet at Temecula, Ca. It received a perfect score. A few years later, it was again entered in the National Meet at Thousand Oaks, Ca. where it again received a perfect score.

Congratulations to Larry on his effort. (More to come on Larry's other cars in future issues of the Drivelines.)










Cruise to Ventura Antique Adventures and Black Bear Diner

Valley V8's "Roadside Americana"

Since we all drive vintage V8 Fords (and other makes) that were once familiar with the Sunday drive, road trips, unique simple eateries, Drive-Ins, Motels and eclectic roadside architecture, I thought I'd highlight some of those memories with a "once a month" bit of nostalgic trivia in our newsletter for 2025. This is the 5th in a series of that fun and simple era of "Roadside Americana" that we all had the privilege of growing up in, and sadly, which has long passed away.




A&W ROOT BEER It all started in 1918 when Roy Allen, an entrepreneur of hotels and restaurants, encountered a traveling chemist boasting of a special formula for draft root beer. The chemist convinced Allen that the drink - a cold frothy combination of herbs, spices, barks and berries - would be a big hit in his hotels and restaurants easily selling for "a nickel a mug". A deal was struck and Allen opened a small drink stand in both Lodi and Stockton, Ca respectively.

In 1920, Frank Wright, an employee with the Lodi location joined with Allen. They pondered a name for the new "temperance beverage" - as prohibition had gone into effect in January 1920. The simple A&W title was created from combining the initials of Allen & Wright. In 1921 the nations first official A&W stand opened on the corner of K & 19th Street in Sacramento, California. Similar to Singer Sewing Machine Co, A&W allowed its investors to sell the popular refreshments, thus the rapid proliferation of the the A&W product and stands. Eventually burgers, hotdogs and other fast food came into the picture. Really??....who didn't love an ice cold frosty mug of A&W root beer or float on a hot summer day ...delivered right to your car by a car hop in the 50s and 60s.???
